

1. Bempton - The Balance of Threat and Hope
 - Accessibility: Excellent
 - Description: Located in the main car park outside of the visitor centre which has plenty of disabled parking. Helen could use her sticks instead of her chair as the Puffin was only a few yards away from where we parked. However, she could have used her wheelchair without any issues.
 - Parking Cost: Free

2. Flamborough Village – Coasty the Puffin
 - Accessibility: Poor
 - Description: Located on the village green, which is fenced off, access being provided by a small gate. This would be impossible for a wheelchair user to operate by themselves. Once on the green, there is a short excursion across grass. Helen could possibly have used her sticks but there was nowhere nearby to sit so she stayed in the car for this one. Parking is on street – it was quiet when we arrived so wasn't a problem to park close by
 - Parking Cost: Free

3. Flamborough Head (North Landing) – Migration “The Dance of Life”
 - Accessibility: Excellent
 - Description: Located outside the café, opposite the main car park which has plenty of disabled parking spaces. Helen could use her sticks instead of her chair as the Puffin was only a few yards away from where we parked. Although the puffin itself was up some stairs, you could pull up adjacent to it in the car and still get a good picture of it and scan the QR code.
 - Parking Cost: Free

4. Sewerby Hall – Butterfly City
 - Accessibility: Satisfactory
 - Description: Located by the pedestrian entrance booth on the right side of the car park as you enter. It's easy to miss as it is under trees and when we visited, the entrance booth was not in use, so it felt a bit out of the way. You can't see it easily as you drive in and I had to go and find it first. Helen needed to use her chair. Disabled parking is good from a quantity point of view, but the puffin was about 150 yards away and the path to it was on an incline. It really needs to be more prominent and closer to the disabled parking spots.
 - Parking Cost: Free (but officially only for Sewerby Hall patrons). To be honest we felt as welcome as a fart in spacesuit

5. Bridlington - Cliff
 - Accessibility: Poor
 - Description: Located at the turnaround point for the land train, there is a steep incline to get to it and it is on grass. Difficult in a wheelchair and impossible on sticks. Parking is close by on North Marine Drive though you'd have to make do with a non-disabled space. This makes getting in and out with a wheelchair very difficult
 - Parking Cost: Free for Blue Badge Holders on North Marine Drive

6. Bridlington – Starlet Puffin
 - Accessibility: Good
 - Description: Located on the promenade near to the disabled parking spots and crazy golf on North Marine Drive. Accessibility is potentially excellent, but only if you can get a disabled parking space. We couldn't, so it was a bit of a trek and a struggle
 - Parking Cost: Free for Blue Badge Holders on North Marine Drive

7. Bridlington – Clowns of the Sea
 - Accessibility: Good
 - Description: Located on a street corner, but there is parking close by. You might have to cross a road to get to it, depending on where you get parked. If it's busy, you might have a bit of a distance to go
 - Parking Cost: Free

8. Bridlington – Stories From the Coast
 - Accessibility: Excellent
 - Description: Located outside the Bayle Museum in a little Cul-de-sac, this one was great for parking and one of the better ones in Bridlington for accessibility
 - Parking Cost: Free

9. Bridlington – Protect Our Mother Earth
 - Accessibility: Good
 - Description: Located on a grassy patch, parking was easy on a side street but the grass patch makes it more of an effort that it needs to be for wheelchair users
 - Parking Cost: Free

10. Bridlington – Come Rain or Shine
 - Accessibility: Satisfactory
 - Description: Located on a cul de sac in Bridlington Centre, parking is a bit hit and miss. We managed to pull into the Taxi Rank. The Puffin is in a fenced, raised area which does have a ramp for wheelchairs, but then the rest is over grass, which isn't ideal. Helen stayed in the car for this one
 - Parking Cost: Depends on where you get parked

11. Bridlington – Kelp
 - Accessibility: Good
 - Description: Located near the funfair, there is on street disabled parking nearby which we managed to snag. This made access possible, otherwise it might have been a bit of a walk/trundle.
 - Parking Cost: Free for blue badge holders

12. Bridlington – Lobster Capital
 - Accessibility: Poor

- Description: Located on the pier known as “Chicken Run” it is accessible by steps or a long way round. We tried walking/trundling in the chair from the previous Puffin but it’s just too dangerous in a wheelchair. So we tried the nearest carpark, Langdale Wharf car park, which is difficult to get out of with a wheelchair, being on a steep slope with a tight turn. Helen was never going to manage it and it was too long a journey to make on her sticks. Also, the disabled spaces are at the bottom of the steps, not near the slope, which makes no sense. In the end, it was a poor choice of location for a Puffin from an accessibility point of view.
- Parking Cost: £1.70 - it was Pay and Display even for Blue Badge holders (a disgrace)

13. Bridlington – Buccaneer

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located outside Bridlington Spa, onsite parking was easy to find, especially for just a few minutes, as Helen’s blue badge allowed us to use double yellows, otherwise it would have been more difficult. This is a quieter part of Bridlington though, which helps
- Parking Cost: Free for blue badge holders

14. Bridlington – Swim Dive Catch

- Accessibility: Poor
- Description: Located next to the paddling pools on the promenade this is reached by steps or a very, very long ramp. It’s not good at all for wheelchair users – impossible for Helen - and would have been better located on the path next to the road overlooking the prom. It’s easy to miss if you’re driving past in the car (which we did!)
- Parking Cost: Free

15. Skipsea – Clue Ella Puffinella

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Located at Mr Moo’s Ice Cream Shop/Café, it is right next to the car park. We got parked so close, the car is in the selfie we took with the Puffin! The car park is gravel though so not ideal for wheelchairs or walking with sticks, which is why we can’t rate it excellent or good.
- Parking Cost: Free

16. Hornsea – Lightbulb Moment

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Located on the promenade at the bottom of a slope, which was easier to get down than up. Could be difficult if you are by yourself. In the end Helen trundled along the prom to the next Puffin which is literally 2 minutes away and I picked her up from Headland View
- Parking Cost: Free in Morrow Avenue Car Park

17. Hornsea – Nuffin for the Puffin

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located in the Floral Hall Sensory Garden, it's a short trundle from a nearby street (Headland View) on almost level ground.
- Parking Cost: Free on street for blue badge holders

18. Hornsea – Puffin Power

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located on the promenade next to the toilets, there are several parking options but we opted for the Car Park on Eastgate which has a couple of disabled spaces. It was a short trundle across the road to the Puffin
- Parking Cost: 70p in Eastgate Car Park

19. Hornsea – Sea Heroes

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located just off Marine Drive, but we both walked down the prom together after the previous Puffin (well I walked, Helen trundled!). It's located on a grassy area, otherwise would have had an excellent rating
- Parking Cost: 70p in Eastgate Car Park, not sure on Marine Drive but might be free with Blue Badge

20. Hornsea – Percy Puffin Litter Picker

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Located outside Funspot amusements, we managed to get to this one by parking on street. It was a little awkward pushing Helen in her chair as there were a number of obstacles and tight turns, and it's on a grass patch. However, not the worst for accessibility by a long shot
- Parking Cost: Free on street

21. Hornsea – Lighthouses

- Accessibility: Poor
- Description: Located on a raised grassy area and only on street parking on double yellows available. The poorest one for accessibility in Hornsea. Helen chose to stay in the car for this one
- Parking Cost: Free on street, but on double yellows and the road is narrow so always possible you'd get a ticket

22. Withernsea – Don't be a Dodo

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located on a grassy area overlooking the sea, it was a short trundle from the car. A bit of an incline but not too bad.
- Parking Cost: Free on street

23. Withernsea – Give Seas a Chance

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located on the prom where parking is free, Helen didn't need to get out of the car for this one. You can pull right up (unless someone is

parked there!). Even if someone had been parked next to it, it would have been a short trundle over level ground

- Parking Cost: Free on street

24. Withernsea – Can He Knit? Yes He Gansey

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Another one located on a grassy area overlooking the sea. The path to it was a bit narrow and there was a step up to it, so Helen used her sticks. There is a bench next to it so she could sit and rest. Not fantastic if you are confined to a wheelchair though
- Parking Cost: Double yellows on street, but there is also a small car park a little distance away (not sure of cost)

25. Withernsea – Nest Builders Well Spotted

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located behind the Lifeboat Station it's a short walk/trundle from the car. Also, some seating and a small picnic area available.
- Parking Cost: Free on street

26. Withernsea – Windy Withernsea

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Another one located on a grassy area overlooking the sea, but it was pretty level and we could park pretty close
- Parking Cost: Free on street

27. Patrington - Winnie

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located on a grass area on a street corner. We managed to park down the road and walk back and it wasn't far at all
- Parking Cost: Free on street

28. Easington - Bembo

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located on a quiet main road we could pull up in the car next to it
- Parking Cost: Free on street

29. Spurn/Kilnsea – Amy's Light

- Accessibility: Poor
- Description: Located next to the car park rather than in it. The ground is not level and there is a plank bridge. It's a bit narrow and Helen didn't fancy it in either her chair or on sticks. So all she saw was the Puffin's head from the car park!
- Parking Cost: Pay and Display

30. Hull – Ocean's Eleven

- Accessibility: Excellent

- Description: Located outside the entrance to the Deep, there is free disabled parking within a short distance. We managed to get parked in the closest disabled space and therefore Helen managed to do this one on her sticks
- Parking Cost: Free

31. Hull – Lagoon Puffin

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Located on the Quay it's a bit of a trek from the nearest parking and some of the surface is cobbled. However, there is free disabled parking on Wellington Street. If you are able bodied it's a short walk from/to the Puffin on Blanket Row, over the narrow bridge across the Marina. This is no good for wheelchair users though. Additionally, because Commercial Street is closed it's quite a long diversion via Daltry Street/English Street to get to it.
- Parking Cost: Free

32. Hull – Lifeboats and Lighthouses

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located on a street corner we were able to get parked on a side street (we parked on double yellows with a blue badge, but there are time limited parking bays). However, note the road is cobbled which isn't great for wheelchairs, otherwise this would have been rated excellent
- Parking Cost: Free

33. Hull – Porcelain Coast

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Located next to the Beverley Gate, it's on a raised, grassed area which is not good for lone wheelchair users. As it's city centre, there are numerous parking options but it isn't possible to park up next to it. We parked on Paragon Street as there is free disabled parking and took in all of the 4 Hull City Centre ones at once. However, it's quite a trek and some of the route to this one is on an incline
- Parking Cost: Free

34. Hull – Turbulent Tides

- Accessibility: Satisfactory
- Description: Located on Carr Lane. As it's city centre, there are numerous parking options but it isn't possible to park up next to it. We parked on Paragon Street as there is free disabled parking and took in all of the 4 Hull City Centre ones at once. However, it's quite a trek so take it steady.
- Parking Cost: Free

35. Hull – Yorkshire's Catch of the Day

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located at the top of Jameson Street next to the Cenotaph. As it's city centre, there are numerous parking options but it isn't possible to park up next to it. We parked on Paragon Street as there is free disabled parking and

took in all of the 4 Hull City Centre ones at once. However, there is closer parking.

- Parking Cost: Free

36. Hull – Headscarf Revolutionary

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located on Paragon Street next to the City Hall where there is free disabled parking. This is the most accessible of the 4 Hull City centre Puffins.
- Parking Cost: Free

37. Cottingham – Human Impact

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located on Cottingham Green, you can park in the Cottingham Green car park which has numerous disabled spaces
- Parking Cost: Free

38. Cottingham – Memories of the Seaside

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located on Hallgate crossroads, our advice is to stay parked in Cottingham Green after viewing the Human Impact Puffin and walk/trundle as this is 2 minutes away
- Parking Cost: Free

39. Risby - Star Gansey

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located in Risby Fish Ponds, it is possible to pull the car right up to it. Note that the main gate closes at 9:30pm so don't stay too late!
- Parking Cost: Free

40. Beverley – Where Sea Meets Shore

- Accessibility: Good
- Description: Located at the end of Flemingate, if you time it right you can park on Armstrong Way and walk round. We would have rated this excellent but it is fenced off on three sides so Helen wasn't able to get a close look at all sides of the Puffin
- Parking Cost: Free after 6:30pm, or £1 in Flemingate Car Park

41. Beverley – Wrecked Puffin

- Accessibility: Excellent
- Description: Located outside the Library there is disabled on street parking next to it.
- Parking Cost: Free

42. Beverley – Beverley Nightlife

- Accessibility: Good

- Description: Located in the Saturday Market there is plenty of nearby parking, though would have been better if it had placed nearer the disabled parking spots! Obviously, don't go on a Saturday!
- Parking Cost: Free
